In April 2022, Concerto Copenhagen, Scandinavia's leading baroque orchestra, will be involved in two projects with strong dramatic and emotional content :

- W.A. Mozart's "Mitridate, re di Ponto", an operatic masterpiece by the 14 year old wunderkind, at the Royal Theatre, Copenhagen and Malmö Opera. Director: Lars Ulrik Mortensen
- "Symphonic drama", in The Black Diamond Concert Hall, Copenhagen, based on the extreme emotions of the "Sturm & Drang" movement. Director: Lars Ulrik Mortensen

Mitridate, re di Ponto:

Lars Ulrik Mortensen's unmistakable flair for drama and strong emotions come to the fore in this unparalelled interpretation of Mozart's youthful masterpiece. Supported by a superb international cast, dancers from "Skånes Dansteater", a historically adapted Concerto Copenhagen and a production team of international acclaim, this production pulls out all the stops!

Mozart's "Mitridate, re di Ponto" is based on a play by Jean Racine, featuring king Mitridate and his two sons, both of whom fall in love with princess Aspasia, amidst a major conflict with the Roman Empire. Stuart Jackson sings the breathtaking part of Mitridate, Emöke Baráth and Morten Grove Frandsen portray his sons, Sifare and Farnace, and the alluring princess Aspasia is sung by Elísabeth Einarsdóttir. The production team includes director Ralf Pleger, sculptor and stage designer Alexander Polzin and choreographer Fernando Melo.

The premiere will take place on April 8th in the Royal Theatre, Copenhagen. Further performances: Copenhagen: April 13th, 22nd and 24th Malmö: April 14th, 18th and 20th.

"Sturm & Drang" symphonies by Kozeluch, Kraus and Mozart

On April 23rd, Concerto Copenhagen and director Lars Ulrik Mortensen perform symphonies inspired by the emotionally charged "Sturm & Drang" movement, in the Black Diamond Concert Hall, Copenhagen.

"Sturm & Drang" was a brief period in Europe between c1760-1780 that contained a youthful and almost "pre-romantic" rebellion against the Enlightenment's worship of rationality and empirical knowledge. Literature, in particular, was marked by these great, unbridled emotions - as in Goethe's The Sorrows of Young Werther - but several composers of the time also gave free rein to these feelings.

The young Mozart's fiery Symphony in G minor, familiar to many from the opening scene of the 1984 film Amadeus, is the main work at this concert. In addition to Mozart, grand, sombre and dramatic symphonies by Swedish-German Joseph Martin Kraus and Czech Leopold Kozeluch, are presented. This is a concert where you get closer to real emotion!
