The time has finally come to give a voice to the forgotten women composers of past centuries. The hundreds of artists gathered under the aegis of the Palazzetto Bru Zane invite you to discover a part of this teeming continent — the age of French Romantic music (1800-1920) — with their interpretation of the *Symphonie en ut mineur* by Sohy, the *Sonate pour violoncelle* by Renié, the *Andante et Intermezzo* by Grandval, the *Grande Fantaisie*-Quintette by Strohl, the *Symphonie nº 3* by Farrenc, *Callirhoé* by Chaminade, *Andromède* by Holmès, the *Sonatine pour violon* by Viardot, the *Sonate pour violoncelle* by Bonis, the *Huit Études mélodiques* by Morel, the *Voix du printemps* by Jaëll, the *Petits Poèmes au bord de l'eau* by Chrétien...

Women composers had great difficulty in making their voices heard and gaining recognition during their lifetimes. Even today, they are all too rarely heard in the concert hall or the opera house. That situation obviously cries out for a change in attitude, but then come the questions: all right, let's programme women composers, but which ones, and which of their works? In this eight-CD set featuring several hundred performers, the Palazzetto Bru Zane offers its initial answer as far as nine-teenth-century France is concerned. The selections range over chamber music, orchestral works, piano pieces and songs. They highlight twenty-one female creators, from already identified personalities like Hélène de Montgeroult, Louise Farrenc, Pauline Viardot, Marie Jaëll and Mel Bonis to such completely unknown figures as Charlotte Sohy, Madeleine Jaeger, Marthe Grumbach, Jeanne Danglas, Hedwige Chrétien and Madeleine Lemariey. From now on, there will be no excuse for ignoring Romantic women composers.

WOMEN COMPOSERS AT THE PALAZZETTO BRU ZANE

This season, the Palazzetto Bru Zane — Centre de musique romantique française focuses on French Romantic women composers, who have been part of its programming and its publications since its creation. A particularly rich and diverse cycle is dedicated to them: it lasts from September 2022 until June 2023 and includes a Festival in Venice, two operas and seven symphonic events in Avignon, Toulouse and Metz, and in several Parisian venues — the Philharmonie de Paris, the Auditorium de Radio France, the Opéra Bastille and the Théâtre des Champs-Élysées.
